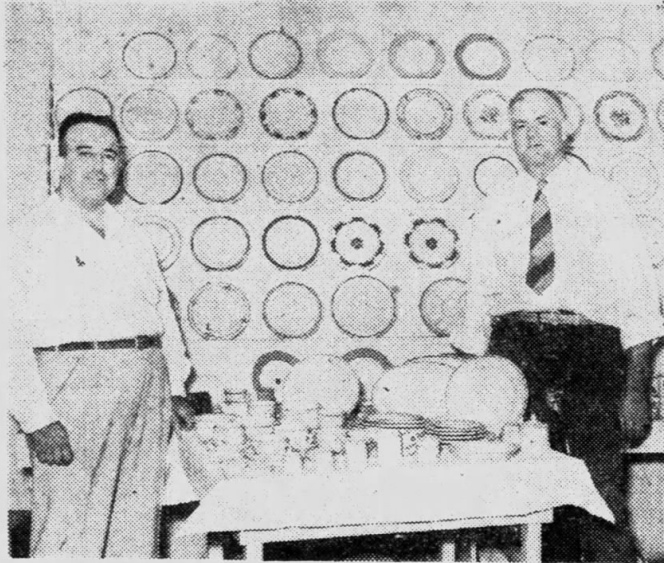

A NEW corporation has been formed in Wichita for the distribution of Carr China to the hotel and restaurant trade. Wichita China Company,
Inc., Is Formed Here
HANDLE CARR CHINA

A new corporation, the Wichita China company, Inc., 550-52 Commerce, has just been formed. This new corporation is the only exclusive china house in the Mid-west, and will distribute Carr China in the state of Kansas to the hotel and restaurant trade, as well as to other supply jobbers. They also will ship to supply jobbers in Missouri, Oklahoma, Texas, Arkansas and Colorado.

Clint C. Anderson, widely known Wichitan, is president of the company. Mr. Anderson is the Traveler's Insurance company representative, having offices in the Beacon building. John Bryant, of Bryant & Bryant, attorneys, is a director. John A. Weigand, who has been in Wichita since 1907, and who has been in constant contact with the hotel and restaurant trade since that time, is secretary, and manager of the firm. He is well known and well-liked in this community.

C. C. Myser, district sales manager for the Carr China company, Grafton, W. Va., was instrumental in organizing the company to distribute his line throughout the southwest. Mr. Myser is a resident of this city, and recently purchased a new home in Forest Hills. Mr. Myser was appointed treasurer of

the concern, and will assist in distribution of Carr China in this territory.

The Wichita China company will handle Carr China exclusively and will be the only concern of its kind in this part of the country, as it will sell only china, and will carry a large stock. Merchandise has been arriving by the carload. Already more than \$25,000 worth of stock has been received here. The company is in position to give immediate service.

The organization extends a cordial invitation to everyone to visit the establishment to inspect their stock.
